Here are Shelbyville 2 Officers Alysa Taylor and Lilyanna Slaven who are dressed to make their Career Presentations!



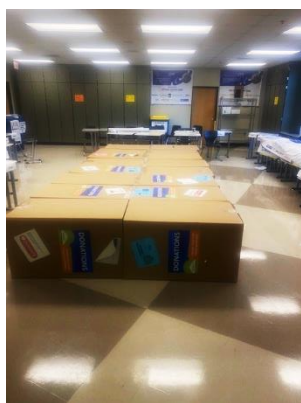
### Ruby Britt – Eastern Hancock

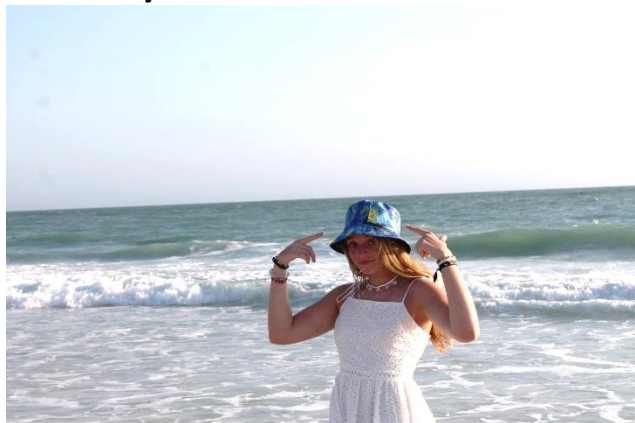

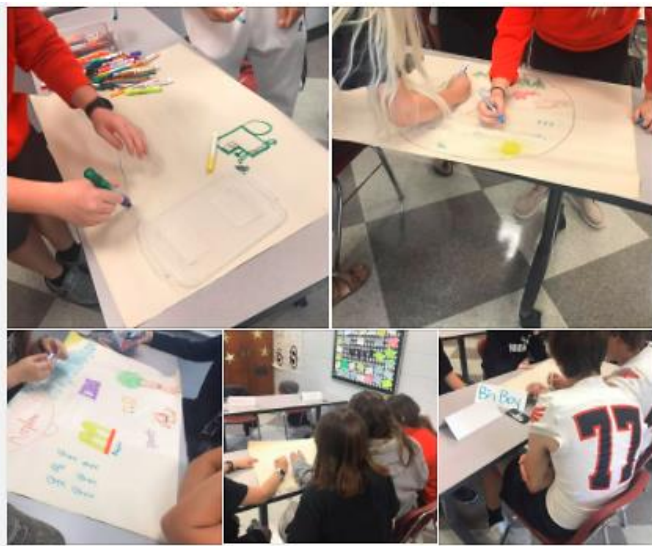
