## 10 Consider Action to Extend MS/HS Mask Mandate

## Minutes:

-Dr. Philhower explained that while some states have currently lifted their mask mandates, they were originally given no prior choice. In Indiana, the state and local health departments have not issued mandates, but rather control measures, or "if-then" directives. In order to stay within these control measures, implementing masking for middle/high school has allowed us to keep more kids physically in school than with any other choice. He recommended staying with the current mask mandate as it exists now, but stated his hope is to end the mandate by the next Board meeting.
-Mr. Brock agreed that he too does not like the masks, but also does not want to quarantine more students than necessary in order to follow the rules of the state.

Mr. Brock moved and Mrs. Stunda seconded a motion to extend the mask mandate for students attending classes in the Middle School \& High School buildings. Motion carried 4-0.
