3 Success Stories

Minutes:

-Mrs. Amanda Pyle, Elementary School Principal, shared how the Eastern Hancock Education Foundation helped EH acquire a \$10,000 grant through United Way called "Recess in a Box." This grant allowed the school to purchase outdoor recess equipment for each class, as well as indoor recess equipment for poor weather days, thus allowing students to remain active even during COVID restrictions.

-Mr. Adam Barton, MS/HS Principal, introduced Mr. Joe Paxton, Communications Teacher, and asked him to share a bit about EH live-streaming, which has been utilized more due to COVID. Mr. Paxton explained that this process began about 5 years ago at a request from teacher Mr. Michael Galyan. They began researching how to live-stream specific events, allowed students the opportunity to serve in this area, started an Intro to Communications class, and challenged themselves to try something new with each live-stream. This trial & error process has led to something the school is very proud of and which the community greatly enjoys. It promotes our school through our own students rather than through outside sources. Mr. Paxton asked senior Turner Myers to share some thoughts. Turner is a part of many live-stream events, including Friday night football games. He expressed how much he has enjoyed this experience and thanked the community for watching.

The Project Hearing was opened by Board President, James R. Jackson, Jr.

Mr. Adam Kinder, Director of Business & Operations, stated that Indiana Code 20-26-7 requires a school corporation to hold a public hearing before spending more than \$1,000,000 of bond proceeds to build, repair or alter a school building. He explained that this project was identified in a facilities study done several years ago that would renovate, update & expand our current locker rooms. The project is estimated at approximately \$2.8-3 million on a 9-year note. The net impact to local taxpayers would be \$0.00.

19 Lease Hearing

Minutes:

The Lease Hearing was opened by Board President, James R. Jackson, Jr.

Mr. Adam Kinder, Director of Business & Operations, explained that the Building Corporation will purchase a portion of the building at the closing for at least the appraisal value. The Building Corporation will then lease that portion of the building back to the School Corporation. The lease rental due from the School Corporation will be paid from property taxes and will be for the lease of the building during the term of the Lease. The lease rental (as shown as a maximum amount in Lease) will be sufficient to pay the principal and interest due to the bond holders.

21 Resolution Authorizing Execution of Lease

Minutes:

-Mr. Kinder explained that as required by the School Leasing Statute (IC 20-47-3), after a hearing, the School Board must approve the Lease and authorize the officers to execute such Agreement. This Lease is the agreement whereby the School Corporation will levy the required property tax to pay the lease payments. The lease payments will be paid to the Building Corporation and used to pay the bond holders.

Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Petry seconded a motion to approve the Resolution Authorizing Execution of Lease as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

22 Resolution Assigning Construction Bids & Contract, Once Received

Minutes:

-Mr. Kinder next explained how the Building Corporation currently owns a portion of Eastern Hancock Middle School. The Building Corporation will also be the issuer of the bonds. The bond proceeds will be held by the trustee bank and will be used to pay the contractors for the work done on the building. As a result, the construction bids and contracts will need to be with the Building Corporation because the Building Corporation will hold the money to pay the contractors. The School Corporation receives the bids and/or contracts and awards the bids and/or contracts under State law but then assigns those bids and/or contracts to the Building Corporation.

Mr. Petry moved and Mrs. Stunda seconded a motion to approve the Resolution Assigning Constructions Bids & Contract, Once Received as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

23 Resolution Approving First Amendment to Master Continuing Disclosure, First Supplement to Master Continuing Disclosure Undertaking & Escrow and Defeasance Agreement
